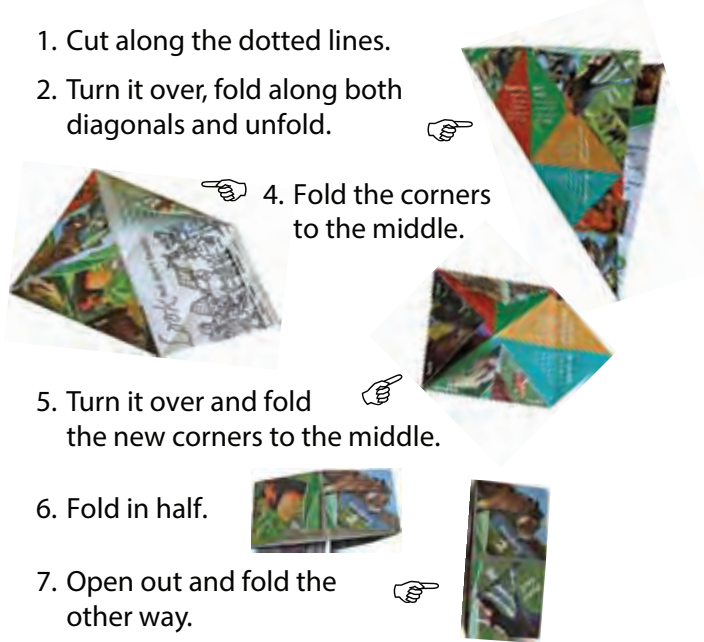




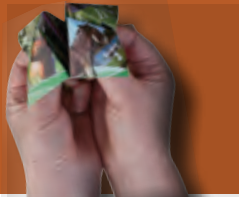
How to make your Beach-nesting Birds flick-flack

1. Cut along the dotted lines.
2. Turn it over, fold along both diagonals and unfold.
4. Fold the corners to the middle.
5. Turn it over and fold the new corners to the middle.
6. Fold in half.
7. Open out and fold the other way.
8. Slide fingers and thumbs under the animals and open and close, or 'flick flack', to play.



Ask a friend to:

- to choose an bird;
- count out the number shown
- to pick a word;
- spell it out
- to pick another word;
- lift the flap to learn and stay safe.



Hooded Plover
To avoid stepping on eggs or chicks stay off the upper beach and dunes in summer.

Watch your step!
These sandy coloured lil' guys are very hard to see.

Red-capped Plover

Leash it
Birds are very scared of even the cutest dogs. So keep your dog close.

Oystercatcher
Oystercatchers use their strong beaks to break open shells and eat the soft insides.

Hammer Head

Fried or Scrambled?
Laid straight onto the sand, eggs are easily stepped on or baked in the sun.

CSI Shorebird
Play detective and look for footprints; it's the best sign birds are near!

Beach-house
If you see a bird pretending it's hurt, there may be eggs or chicks around; so look out.

Sooty Oystercatcher
Birds love relaxing in the safety and shade of shelters during the hot summer.
